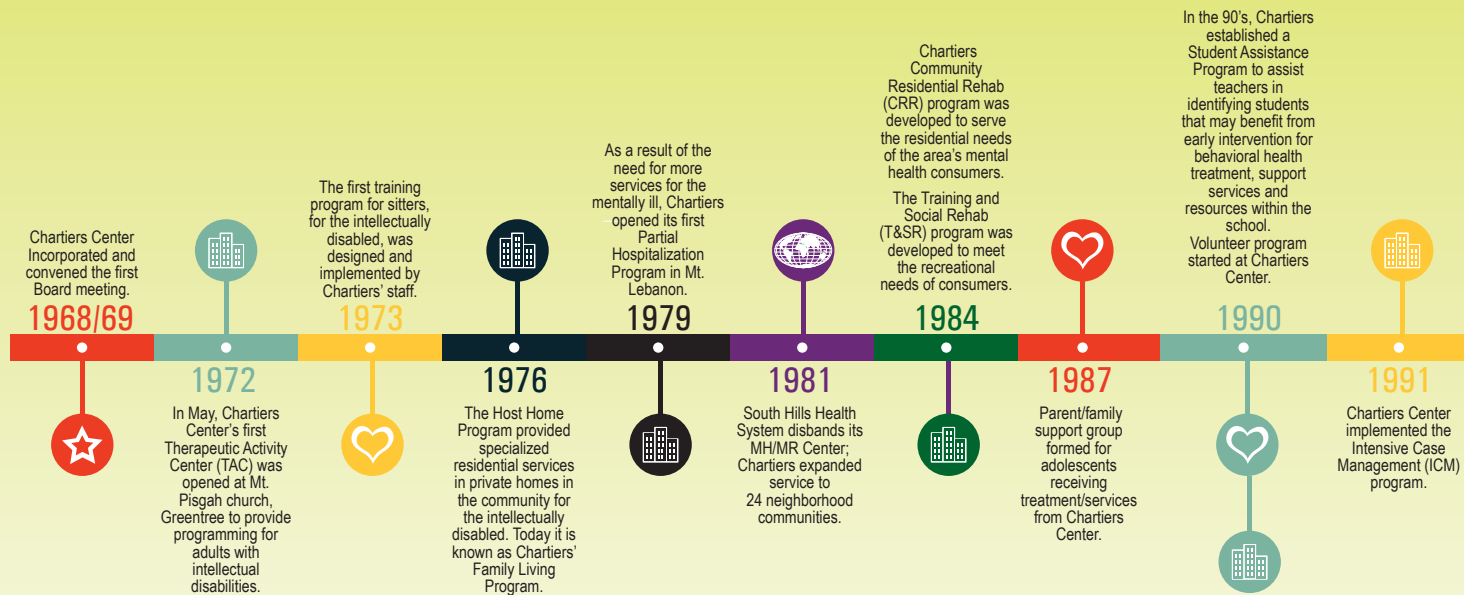

In 1968 Charters Center opened its doors as Charters Community Mental Health and Retardation Center; a name later changed to reflect our sensitivity to stigma and need for advocacy and respect. I wondered what else was going on in the world in 1968, which now seems so long ago. Here are a couple of things to put 1968 into perspective:

And of course, we lost Martin Luther King and Robert Kennedy to assassin's bullets.

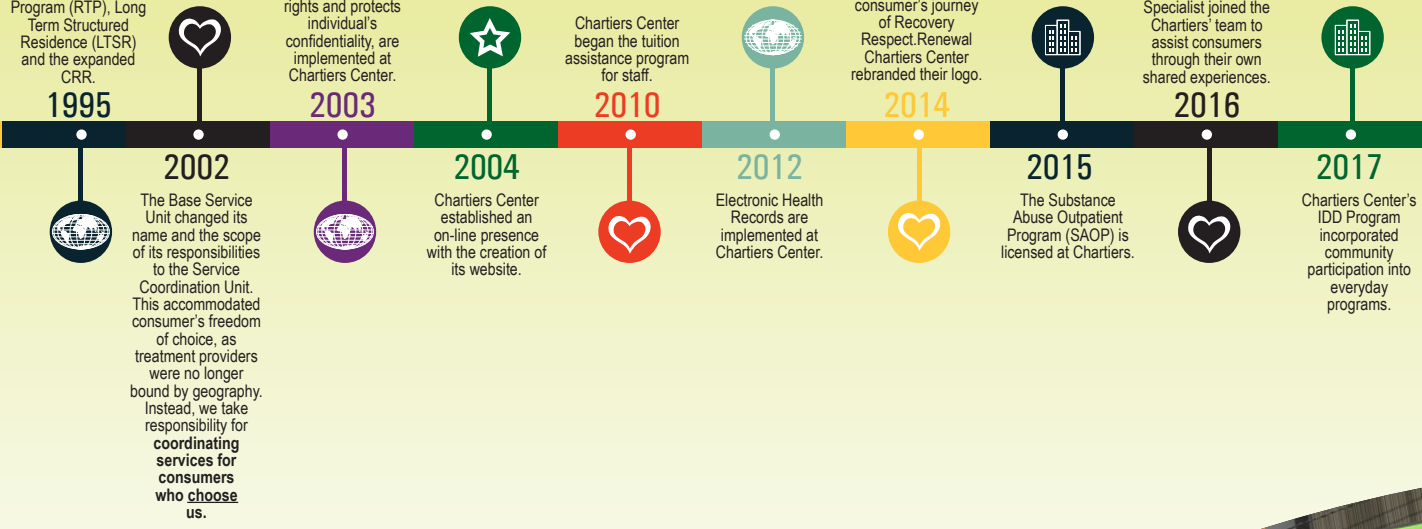
As we have celebrated this milestone year, we have taken time to reflect upon the achievements of our agency, the innovations and expansion of our programs, the lives we hope we have helped to make better and the comfort we may have brought our neighbors knowing we were here to help. But as we all know, time marches on and we are focused on making our next fifty years better than the first. It has been, and will be, our honor to continue to serve the community through service to our consumers as we help them to achieve the life they wish to lead.

As the Unified Systems deinstitutionalized treatment services; residential programming for behavioral health consumers was provided within the community. This led to Chartiers expanded delivery of service to include the Residential Treatment Program (RTP), Long Term Structured Residence (LTSR) and the expanded CRR.

The new Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act (HIPAA) regulations, which increased individual rights and protects individual's confidentiality, are implemented at Chartiers Center.

Inspired by our consumer's journey of Recovery Respect.Renewal Chartiers Center rebranded their logo.

Chartiers Center opened their 4th program addressing housing for the homeless. Peer Specialist joined the Chartiers' team to assist consumers through their own shared experiences.

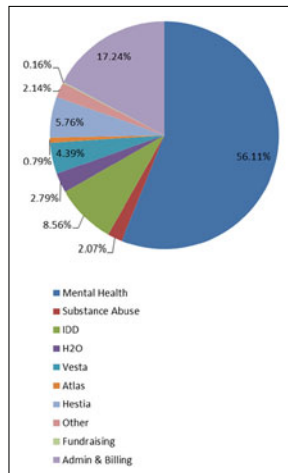
